LEARN TO FLY

There may be many reasons for wishing to gain your pilot's licence. For leisure, as a new hobby, a personal challenge or even fulfilling a lifetime's ambition. Or you may be looking for a future career in aviation and want to be the airline captain of tomorrow. Gaining your licence may be much easier than you think.

As a complete beginner there are two main licences available to the new Private Pilot:

- The Private Pilots Licence (PPL) or
- The Light Aircraft Pilots Licence (LAPL)

The Private Pilots Licence is an ICAO (International Civil Aviation Organisation) Licence recognised across the world & is regulated in the UK by EASA (European Aviation Safety Agency). This licence gives you the freedom to pilot an aircraft within your qualified category not just within the UK but worldwide.



The Light Aircraft Pilot Licence is similar to the full PPL but will only allow you to fly within the UK plus the European Member States. There are some restrictions with the LAPL which we can discuss with you in more detail to ensure you complete the training that is right for your needs now and in the future.



Your new licence will allow you to fly single engine piston aircraft like the one pictured above in daylight hours under VFR (visual flight rules) whilst you are in sight of the surface. The PPL will allow you to add further qualifications later such as an instrument rating or night rating. Just imagine piloting yourself and your family or friends to France for the day!

ARE THERE ANY AGE LIMITS?

The minimum age to commence training and for hours to count towards licence issue is 14. At 16 you can fly solo and at age 17 you can apply for licence issue. There are no upper age limits.

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

The full PPL consists of a minimum of 45 hours flight training which includes the following:

- 25 hours dual flight instruction.
- 10 hours supervised solo flight time.
- A solo cross-country flight of at least 150 nautical miles landing at 2 airfields along the route and then returning to the airfield of departure.
- On completion of your flight training you will have a Skills Test with a CAA Authorised Examiner to demonstrate the skills learnt.

In addition to the flight time there are nine ground exams which you will need to pass. All are multiple choice answers in subjects that hopefully you will enjoy learning. The exams are an integral part of becoming a safe, competent and experienced pilot. These are:

Air Law, Aeroplane General, Principles of Flight, Flight Performance and Planning, Navigation, Meteorology, Human Performance and Limitations, Operational Procedures and Communications.



IS IT EXPENSIVE?
